Elevate America Background

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity has been designated by the State of Illinois to be the lead agency to implement this program. The main purpose of this program is to offer individuals opportunities to increase computer skills that are essential to achieving employment goals. This is accomplished by offering free access to online courses and select certification exams. Both the online courses and exams provide skills and credentials for using Microsoft software products. The Elevate America Program is offered through these workforce networks which will issue vouchers for customers to redeem for free online courses and certification exams:



- Illinois workNet Centers, including Chicago workNet
- Digital Divide Network, which includes Community Technology Centers (CTCs) and Illinois Community Action Agencies (ICAAs)
- High School Career and Technical Education programs approved by the Illinois State Board of Education
- Community College Career and Technical Education and Adult Education

Elevate America Background



- With the Elevate America program there are some basic computer skill and intermediate/business worker courses, as well as many resources for all computer skill levels available to anyone without a voucher.
- All courses and resources available to anyone without a voucher are available through Illinois workNet. Customers who need to access these resources should go to <http://www.illinoisworknet.com> and click on Elevate America.
- The LWIAs and other workforce network partners need to know about the courses and resources that anyone can access because they are included with strategies and guidance on assisting customers with this program.
- **IMPORTANT!! Enter all courses via Illinois workNet. For security reasons, Microsoft will block multiple logins from other domains.**

Types of Vouchers

There are three types of vouchers as shown in the chart below:



	Type of Vouchers	Microsoft Software	Computer Level
1.	Business Worker Online Course Voucher	Microsoft Windows XP, Office 2003, Windows Vista, or Office 2007	Intermediate/Business Worker
2.	Technical Professional Online Course Voucher	Microsoft professional information technology applications including server administration, web and application programming, and other professional technical areas	Technical Professional
3.	Business Certification Exam Vouchers	Office 2003 and Office 2007	Intermediate/Business Worker

How LWIAs Access Elevate America Resources

The Illinois workNet Workforce Professionals Pathway accessed via <http://www.illinosworknet.com> is where all information for this project is being made available to workforce professionals within all participating distribution networks:



- Frequently requested Elevate America documents are available without a password by going to the Workforce Professionals Pathway and then clicking on the link.
- Other resources, guidance, discussion forum, videos, documents, and voucher allocation requires a workforce professional's login. After logging in, go to Resources/Elevate America.

Resources Available Now!

Many resources for this program are already available to workforce professionals now. The information is a work in progress, so new information is posted almost daily:

Providing Guidance to Customers

Log into the workforce professionals pathway for details, but here are some general guidelines for working with WIA/IWDS registered customers (i.e. adult, dislocated worker, and youth), and WIA registered incumbent workers:



- LWIAs only provide vouchers to REGISTERED customers. All adult, dislocated worker, and youth customers must be registered in IWDS prior to issuing vouchers.
- Customers who are not registered may be referred (using Illinois workNet) to a local participating Digital Divide CTC or ICAA site. This is the only workforce network that will issue vouchers to individuals who are not enrolled or registered.
- Vouchers are issued based upon computer skill level and career pathway. Use the workforce professionals pathway to guide you in identifying a strategy and the correct vouchers to issue to customers.

Customers Computer Skill Levels

There are courses for three computer levels. A fact sheet for each level is available to customers from Illinois workNet. The Basic Skills courses do not require a voucher. You may have customers on a career pathway that requires basic, business worker, or technical professional computer skills. Regardless of the career pathway selected, everyone benefits by having basic computer skills.

Strategy to move customer to Intermediate Computer Skills/Business Worker –
Have customer complete basic computer skills courses now. Determine if they can take them on their own or need assistance. Provide a timeline to complete basics that allows time for a voucher to be issued for Business Worker Courses and Business Certification Exams.

Intermediate/Business Worker Skill Level

You may have customers on a career pathway that requires intermediate/business worker computer skills. For customers who already have basic computer skills, you can issue vouchers for the Business Worker Online Courses aimed at preparing individuals for Microsoft Business Certification exams.

Technical Professional Skill Level

You may have customers on a career pathway that requires technical professional computer skills. Courses in this skill level are for customers who already have intermediate skills, and are on a career pathway to work in an Information Technology occupation. This series of online courses is specifically designed to provide the knowledge and skills necessary to pass Microsoft Technical Certification exams.

Allocate Vouchers to Customers

Beginning July 31, 2009:

- LWIAs only provide vouchers to REGISTERED customers. All adult, dislocated worker, and youth customers must be registered in IWDS prior to issuing vouchers.
- Customers who are not registered may be referred (using Illinois workNet) to a local participating Digital Divide CTC or ICAA site. This is the only workforce network that will issue vouchers to individuals who are not enrolled or registered.
- Vouchers are issued based upon computer skill level and career pathway. Use the workforce professionals pathway to guide you with identifying a strategy and correct vouchers to issue to customers.



Allocate Vouchers to Customers

Beginning July 31, 2009:

- All workforce distribution networks will use Illinois workNet to allocate vouchers to customers. LWIAs will use the following steps:
 - Have the customer set up their My Illinois workNet account.
 - To help them remember their User Name and Password, use the wallet-sized cards or a one-page instruction sheet - both include a place to record this information.
 - Workforce Professionals log into the Workforce Professionals Pathway and go to the Elevate America page.
 - Search for the customer in both IWDS and Illinois workNet.
 - Click to select the customer, the IWDS identification number will become attached to the Illinois workNet record.



Allocate Vouchers to Customers

Beginning July 31, 2009:

- LIWA voucher allocation steps continued...
 - Verify that account information is complete.
 - Select type and quantity of vouchers.
 - Click to allocate vouchers.
 - Print next steps for customer, or email them, or tell customers to log into their My Illinois workNet account to see their next steps.



Become a Microsoft Certiport Testing Center

To offer individuals locations where they may take the Business Certification exams at no cost, Illinois workNet Centers are encouraged to become Certiport Testing Centers. These are locations where individuals go to take proctored Microsoft Certificate exams. During the Elevate America Program, there are no fees to become a testing center.

To become a testing center:

- Review the Microsoft Certiport Testing Center Fact Sheet.
- Identify staff to act as exam proctors.
- Visit the Certiport website and complete the online site registration form.
- Certiport reviews registrations daily and will reply to the contact identified on the form.
- Participate with training.
- Install the exam software and install Office 2003 and Office 2007 software.



How Customers Access Elevate America

All customers go to <http://www.illinoisworknet.com> and click on Elevate America. Right now your customers can:

- Learn about Elevate America.
- Access courses that don't require vouchers:
 - Digital Literacy
 - Office Getting Started
- Beginning July 31, 2009 your customers redeem all three types of vouchers by logging into their My Illinois workNet account:
 - Business Worker Online Courses – Customers see voucher numbers and login instructions.
 - Technical Professional Online Courses – Customers see voucher numbers and login instructions.
 - Business Certification Exams Requiring Vouchers – Customers see voucher numbers and instructions on how to redeem at a testing center.



LWIAs Next Steps

There are steps that each LWIA participating with Elevate America can begin now:

- Review the fact sheets and information available via the Workforce Professionals Pathway.
- Become familiar with the Individuals Elevate America Web page.
- Have customers set up their My Illinois workNet account and use resources such as the wallet-sized cards to help them remember their user name and password.
- Identify customers now who benefit from Digital Literacy courses (that do not require a voucher) and have them begin the courses.
- Identify customers who benefit from enhancing their intermediate/business worker computer skills and introduce them to Elevate America and/or earning a Microsoft Business Certification.
- Identify customers who benefit from technical professional courses and introduce them to Elevate America.
