The WIA-funded component of the program (a daily class) helps youth develop the basic employment skills and competencies needed to succeed in the workplace. Staff provide individualized tutoring and support for program participants; students may also use the RVC Success Center's tutoring services. Staff assist participants secure job shadowing experiences, internships, and jobs and/or apply for further education/training. During the school year, the program meets at Guilford after school for two hours twice weekly; program tutors provides individualized tutoring in specific problem areas identified by the school's bi-lingual staff or other teachers with whom the tutors consult. During the summer, youth may attend special program-ming conducted by the Rockford School District; if most program youth are attending summer school, WIA program staff will assist at the school. After the summer school program ends, WIA youth will meet for three hours once weekly at the Workforce Connection to receive basic skills remediation/ enhancement tutoring and work readiness/career exploration activities. Youth may participate in job shadowing activities, internships, and subsidized or unsubsidized work experiences (school year and summer). The program provides vocational instruction (another funding source), work readiness skills training, and intensive placement assistance, focusing on extensive job coaching. While in the program, the youth may enter subsidized or unsubsidized work experiences with employers. Historically, many employers hire youth outright. Youth are coached by job coaches during their initial months on the job. Program runs year-round, with the summer component including tutoring, mentoring, counseling and/or job placement follow-up: Youth who enter the program in their junior year will be in the program two years.</p>

The program provides extensive mentoring and counseling, job-readiness and life-skills instruction, job shadowing, internships (with job coaching by program staff), and tutoring. During the school year, the youth meet after school for two hours twice a week with individual counseling/mentoring for each youth performed at other times. During the summer, youth participate in the program eight hours per week, except when they are in an internship (20 hours per week for four weeks) with various local employers. Mentoring and case management are on-going throughout the year. The program employs a certified teacher and degreed instructors to tutor the youth. The instructors also will provide study skills training and discuss technical schools/colleges, providing information about technical school/college enrollment and financial aid.</p>
