Daniel Serota is Vice President of Government and Public Affairs at Aon, a leading global professional services firm. Daniel creates meaningful and sustainable connections with a wide variety of stakeholders to further Aon's public service mission and community outreach activities. Daniel was appointed to the Illinois Workforce Innovation Board by Governor J.B. Pritzker of Illinois and sits as the chair of the Work-Based Learning and Apprenticeship Committee, which is focused on growth of apprenticeship programs in Illinois.



Julio Rodriguez is Deputy Director for the DCEO Office of Employment and Training (OET). Under Julio's leadership, OET has met or exceeded performance, developed nationally recognized sector-based training initiatives, secured 50 million additional federal dollars to support new programs, developed training policy to increase the number of individuals receiving credentials, and led a team that launched a successful initiative to expand the use of new technology in the workforce system.
