


## **Accessing Navigator Tools**

- 5. Select Apprenticeship Illinois from the Group Search page.






6. Select Navigator Tools

  - Select the Organization Name that the apprenticeship will be added to.






## Add a New or Expanded Pre-Apprenticeship

- 1. On the Organization, scroll down to the Apprenticeships section.
  - Click Add Apprenticeship



- 2. Complete the Add Apprenticeship modal:
  - The + sign and info bubbles provide additional information to assist with completing the modal.
  - Enter RAPIDS ID for the Sponsor this field is required.
  - Enter Training Provider RAPIDS ID if known.
  - Enter Employer RAPIDS ID if known. More than one ID can be entered here if this is a sector partnership or employer collaborative.
  - Select from the list (expand the definitions at the top of the modal):
    - New Program
    - New Pre-apprenticeship Program RAPIDS ID's will not be required.
    - Expanded: Added New Industry
    - Expanded: Added New Occupation
    - Expanded: Added New Employer
    - Expanded: Used Funds to Add Apprentices
    - Expanded: Pre-Apprenticeship RAPIDS ID's will not be required.
  - Select how the apprenticeship will be served:
    - Case Managed
    - OII
    - Apprentices will not be uploaded to workNet
  - Click if the program is on the Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL).
    - To verify click the link to check the list.
    - If it is not on the list, click the link to submit a request to add the program.
  - Click Save
