



Dear Ms Eaton;

This letter is in reference to the projects recently submitted through the EcoCAT (Ecological Compliance Assessment Tool) website. The initial report generated for your project indicated the presence of protected resources in the vicinity of the project location. Protected resources include the rice rat (Oryzomys palustris) and copper-bellied water snake (Nerodia erythrogaster neglecta).

The Department has completed its review of the project and determined that the action is likely to have an adverse impact on these populations. To minimize these impacts, the Department recommends the following measures be implemented by the contractor:

- Work crews should be told about the presence of the protected species
- If possible, work should occur between November 1st and March 1st.
- Before beginning any work, walk the ditch bottom in order to allow any snakes or rats to move out of harm's way.
- If protected species are encountered, stop work until they have left the vicinity.

Consultation on the part of the Department is completed. Please notify the Department of the decision regarding these recommendations, whether the applicant will:

- Proceed with the action as originally proposed;
- Modified the action per Department recommendations (please specify which measures if not all will be required); or
- Forgo the action.

This consultation is valid for two years unless new information becomes available that was not previously considered; the proposed action is modified; or additional species, essential habitat, or Natural Areas are identified in the vicinity. If the project has not been implemented within two years of the date of this letter, or any of the above listed conditions develop, a new consultation is necessary.

The natural resource review reflects the information existing in the Illinois Natural Heritage Database at the time of the project submittal, and should not be regarded as a final statement on the site being considered, nor should it be a substitute for detailed site surveys or field surveys required for environmental assessments. If additional protected resources are encountered during the project's implementation, you must comply with the applicable statutes and regulations. Also, note that termination does not imply IDNR's authorization or endorsement of the proposed action.



This letter is in reference to IDNR Project # 1203019, 1203020. The letter stated that there are protected resources in the area that work is to be performed. The species included in the report are the rice rat and copper-bellied water snake. Based on the recommendations listed, the worksite will abide by the following:

- Work crews will be told about the presence of the protected species and photos of the protected species will be presented in advance to the work crew.
- Before beginning any work, crews will walk the ditch bottom in order to allow any snakes or rats to move out of harm's way.
- If protected species are encountered, crews will stop work until they have left the vicinity.

The worksite has decided to forgo the last recommendation of starting November 1st because the work is being funded by a National Emergency Grant that requires the work to be completed in a specific time period.
