

FY27 Youth Served Guidelines for 3473 IYIP

- All grant funding for IYIP is based upon number of youth served.
 - Youth served is reported through IL workNet and also on the Periodic Performance Report or PPR
- Expectation for FY27 (July 1 to August 31, 2026) is all funded providers will be serving youth with IYIP grant funds
- Must serve youth who are officially enrolled in Illinois workNet system
 - Youth can be previously enrolled youth or newly enrolled as long as your agency is doing youth programming currently
 - Costs should be reasonable and necessary based upon number of youth currently being served
- The Short-term (ST) and Long-term (LT) maximum subsidized days remain the same. Remember, these days are calendar days (not days worked) while enrolled in a job or training placement subsidized by grant funds. If a youth is placed in a subsidized placement on June 1 for example, then the month of June counts as 30 days. In this example, the youth would have 60 sub days in ST remaining on July 1.
 - 90 subsidized days maximum for Short-term programming
 - 180 subsidized days maximum for Long-term programming
 - *Please remember youth can continue in a non-subsidized placement after all sub days have been used up.
- Youth who are currently enrolled may remain enrolled after June 30 and continue IYIP services as needed.
 - Providers do NOT need to discharge youth at end of Fiscal Year 2026. The June 30 date is the close of FY26 but does not end youth programming.
 - Youth may continue to work a non-subsidized job (not paid with any grant funds) after they have exhausted their 90 or 180 subsidized days.
