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# Performance Goals, Assessment & Evaluation

- Performance: The Interagency Work Group established a performance accountability subgroup consisting of representatives from the core partners. The group identified the extent to which each core partner either now captures the data elements required or has access to the data required from other sources. The subgroup then identified gaps between the data required to support performance accountability and the data each core partner now collects, stores and reports. Based on an analysis of historical and current participant outcomes, each core partner will negotiate baseline WIOA performance measures for each indicator, as applicable.
- Assessment and Evaluation: The Illinois Workforce Innovation Board (IWIB) has identified benchmarking as a leading strategy to assess and evaluate results. The annual benchmarking report is submitted to the IWIB, Governor and General Assembly as a method for measuring progress of the state's workforce development system. Illinois will expand on this approach as part of the WIOA implementation strategy.

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#### **Required Assurances**

Local and Stakeholder Review and Comment: The State of Illinois is seeking input into the development of the Unified Plan from local board members, chief elected officials, business representatives, labor organizations, institutions of higher education, the entities responsible for planning or administrating the core programs, primary stakeholders, including other organizations that provide services to individuals with barriers to employment, and the general public.

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
