

IEBS provides macro and micro business economic conditions in Illinois in order to make data driven decisions regarding business health, expansion, and layoff aversion. The intuitive design and unique integration of data empowers users to keep up with the most current conditions of IL businesses to quickly analyze and investigate state business landscapes and formulate innovative business outreach strategies.

- The Dun & Bradstreet Data Cloud is an aggregation of business data from over 30,000 sources.
- IEBS uploads the DnB Illinois business data quarterly via an API and transforms the data into the IEBS organization and predictive analysis screens
- DnB data is stored in system to track longitudinal health and well being of the company

Unemployment Insurance Information

Unemployment insurance is an IDES state-operated program designed to partially replace lost wages when you are out of work. It is for an emergency when you are temporarily or permanently out of a job, or if you work less than full time because of lack of work. If you meet the eligibility requirements of the law, you will have some income while you are looking for a job, up to a maximum of 26 full weeks in a one-year period. How to Submit a UI Claim







Material Change Examples

Spend Growth

This most often is an indication the company is in a research and development phase.

Decrease in Scale

A company has significantly reduced its output or may have shut or slowed down production lines.

Increase in Borrowing

The company has increased its borrowing from lenders. This could be an indication of a company adding production lines or seeking capital for improvements.

Early Signs of Decay

A company with a failing business model, or a company that has not innovated or updated in a long time. This could also be an indicator that a company has lost contracts or business or clients.




