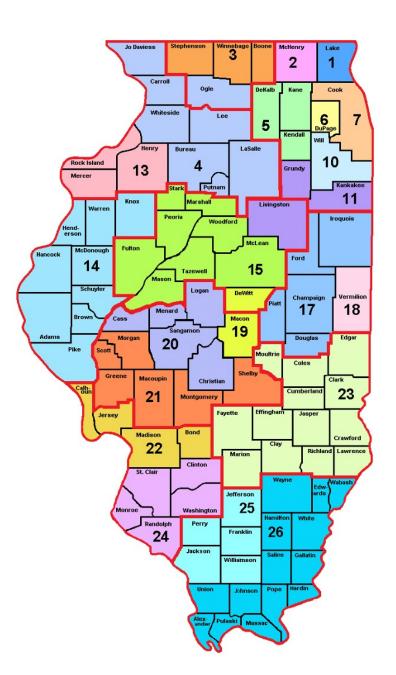



Virtual Interviews, Here to Stay?

- 1,100 U.S. employers
- 82% said they adopted virtual interviews for candidates because of the pandemic.
- 93% expect to continue to use virtual interviews in the future.





Virtual Interviews, Here to Stay?

- 61% of surveyed recruiters said the hiring process will be a combination of virtual and in-person going forward
- 22% said they plan to conduct all virtual hiring.





Types of Virtual Interviewing

- 1. Live Video Interviews or two-way live
 - Used as a replacement for in-person interviews in a remote environment
 - Interviewers use videoconferencing tools

- 2. One-Way Interviews
 - Typically used earlier in the hiring process as a preliminary screen interview, not meant to replace face-to-face, live interactions.

Benefits to Virtual Interviewing

- Accessibility
- A Shorter time-to-hire for the employer
- A more streamlined hiring process
- A better candidate experience for some because applicants have more control over when and where they interview.





Benefits to One-Way Virtual Interviews

- Standardized the preliminary interview process
- Boosts hiring collaboration, as hiring managers can provide input earlier on.
- Results in better hiring outcomes
- Employers can interview more people giving candidates more opportunities
- The decision on whether a candidate advances isn't solely dependent on one person, reducing bias.

Illinois workNet Interview Prep Tool

- Interview Prep Tool Practice for interviews. New features allow students to:
 - Browse through over 1,000 types of interviews
 - Record responses to interview questions
 - Customize and create their own interview and choose from over 12,000 questions
- Practicing an interview in advance will get students thinking about how best they can answer questions they may be asked.



Accessing the Interview Prep Tool

- Free to use and access with an Illinois workNet account
- Once account has been created
 - Login to Illinois workNet
 - Click the Resumes button in the banner
 - Select Take a Practice Interview
- Browse through over 1,000 interviews available to create your own interview from over 12,000 available questions



Tech Tips to Prepare for the Practice and Interview

- Make sure microphone and webcam work properly. (Close any other programs that may be using a webcam or microphone, especially video chat programs such as Skype.)
- Prior to an interview, if the customer knows whether it will be on Zoom, Teams, or another platform they should check and make sure their audio/video works in that platform to make certain they are ready to go.
- Customers may find that their computer needs updates, software needs to be updated or installed, or their internet speed works better in one area of their house than another.
- Additionally, they will want to be comfortable using the webinar or meeting platform and device equipment.
- They should be sure that they know how to easily mute and unmute themselves and that they are able to access any files they may want to send.
