***Definitions for Goal***

Increase in the number of persons with disabilities, including those receiving SSI and SSDI benefits, served through the Illinois workNet Center service delivery system in the state	The number of individuals with disabilities, who have entered the Illinois workNet system through either a physical Illinois workNet Center or the Illinois workNet Portal, provided the necessary personal information to identify them, indicated they are a person with a disability and received at least one service related to WIA whether provided by support staff or through self-directed search.
Numbers of participants to receive core services	The number of individuals with disabilities who have been registered in WIA, enrolled to received WIA services, and received at least one core service such as labor market information, initial assessment of skill levels, and job search and placement assistance
Numbers of participants to receive intensive services	The number of individuals with disabilities who have completed at least one WIA core service and who have received a WIA intensive service such as comprehensive assessments, development of individual employment plans and counseling and career planning.
Numbers of participants to receive training services	The number of individuals with disabilities who have met the requirements for WIA intensive services and who have received a WIA training service.
Education outcomes	The number of individuals with disabilities who have completed a training service related to a pursuit of employment.
Number earning an industry-recognized credential	The number of individuals with disabilities who have completed the required coursework and/or testing and received an industry-recognized credential for that achievement.
Number of Illinois workNet Centers customers with disabilities who are co-enrolled with Illinois workNet Center partners	The number of individuals with disabilities who are participating in multiple programs that include enrollment in WIA and another Illinois workNet Center partner agency program such as Vocational Rehabilitation.
Entered employment rate	Of all individuals with disabilities who were not employed at registration: the number who enter employment in the quarter after exit divided by the number who exit during the quarter.
Retention rate	Of all individuals with disabilities who are employed in the first quarter after exit: the number of adults who are employed in the second and third quarter after exit divided by the number of adults who exit during the quarter.
Six-months' average earnings	Of all individuals with disabilities who are employed in the first, second, and the third quarter after exit: the total earnings in the second quarter plus total earnings in the third quarter after the exit quarter divided by the number of adults who exit during the quarter.
Average wages	The total average earnings of individuals with disabilities in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> and 3 <sup>rd</sup> quarter after exit. This is calculated as the total earnings in the second quarter plus total earnings in the third quarter after exit divided by the number of individuals who are employed in the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarters after exit.
Increased wages	The total average wages difference of individuals with disabilities calculated as the wage from the job record prior to participation subtracted from the wages from the job record at exit.
