

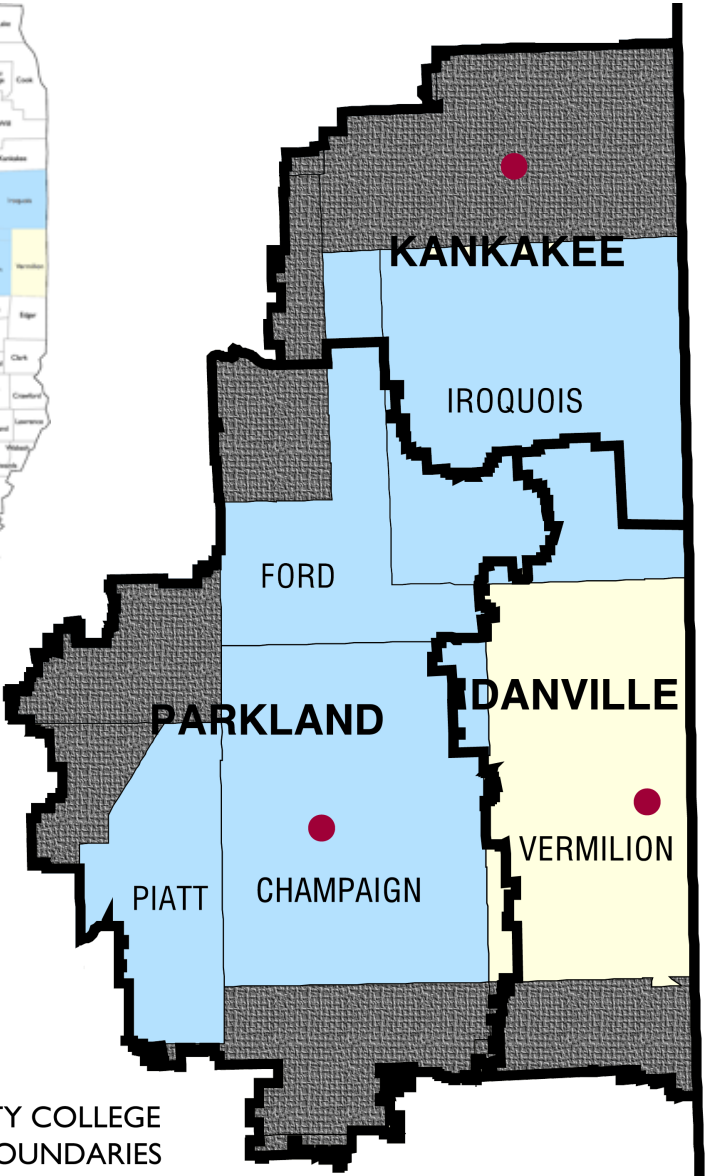

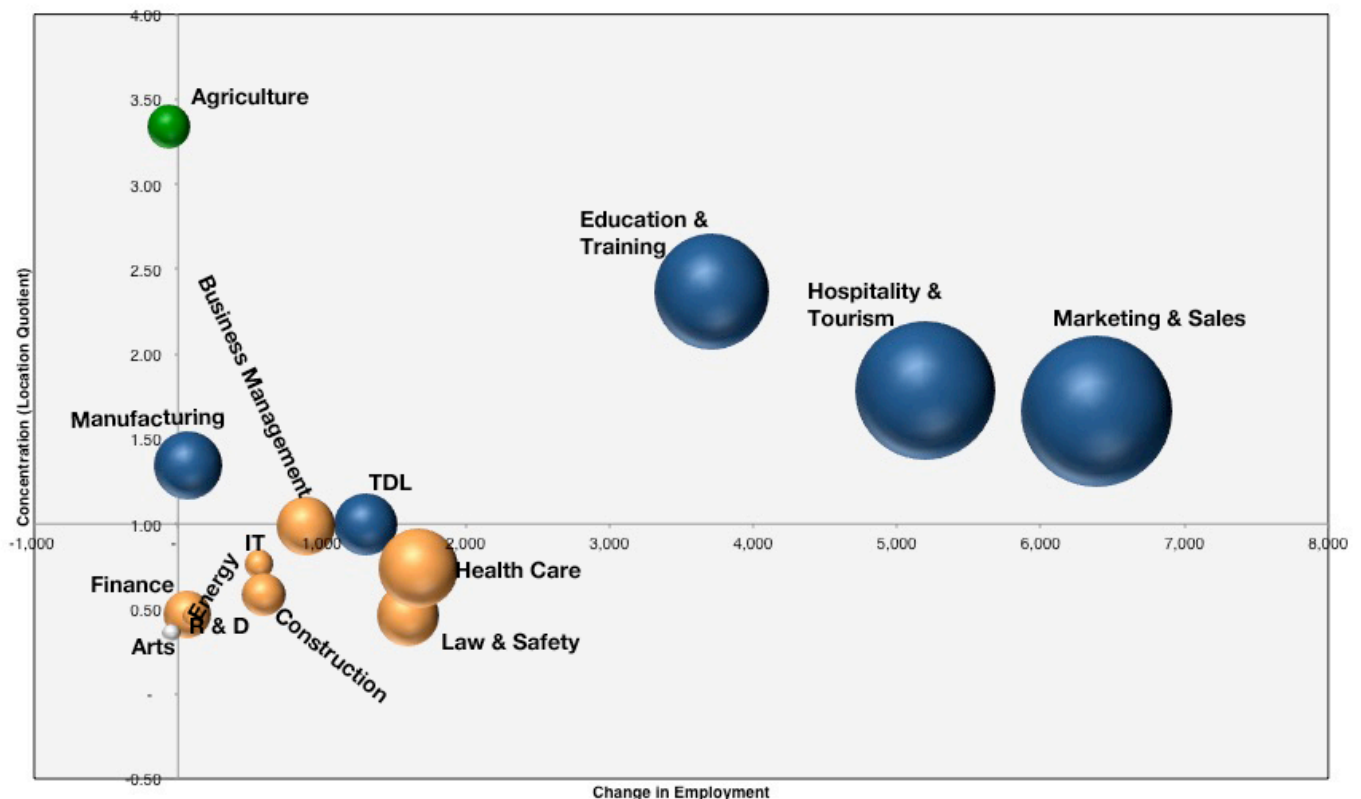

MAJOR INDUSTRY CLUSTERS IN THE EAST CENTRAL REGION



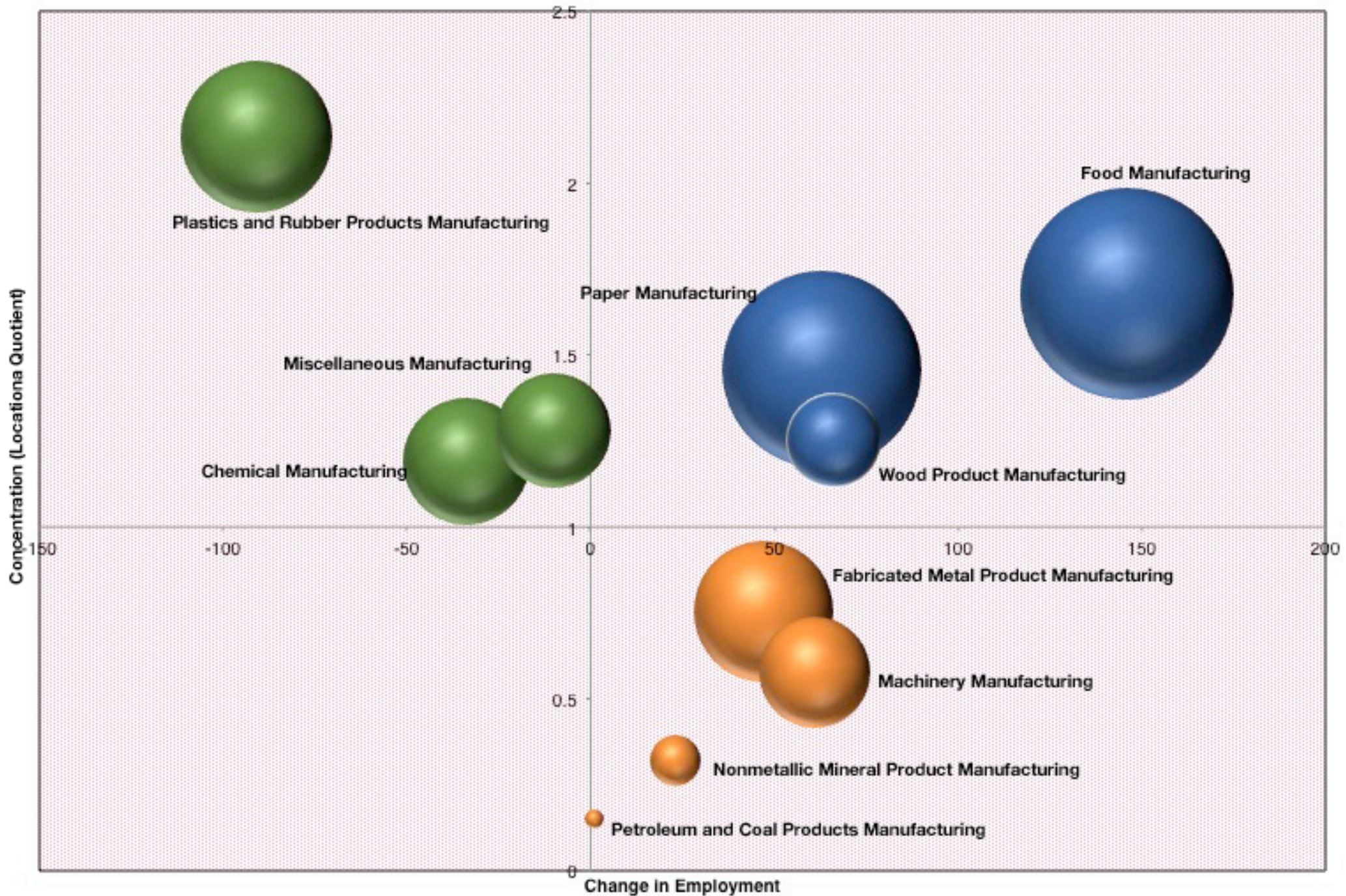
