## **Trade Adjustment Assistance Rapid Response Process Outline**

## Rapid Response Activities are Required for all Trade Impacted Events

## State level includes all events of 25 or more workers,

## Local events are less than 25 workers.

Per the Governor's Agreement with the Secretary of Labor, Trade Rapid Response is to occur upon the filing of a petition.

- 1. Potential Notification of Trade Impact
  - a. Media
  - b. Notification
    - i. Warn Notice
    - ii. Grantee/Local Workforce Innovation Area (LWIA)
- 2. Filing of Petition and Posting of Certification should be checked with the following Web sites:
  - a. Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Office of Employment and Training (Commerce) Web site or staff notification
  - b. DOL Web site
- 3. Commerce Regional Representative Rapid Response Staff activities:
  - a. Investigates event gathering details
  - b. Notifies Grantee/LWIA of event
  - c. Gathers company specific data and demographics for Initial On-Site Meeting by making contact with company or employee representative
  - d. Coordinates Initial On-Site Meeting with company, IDES, and Grantee/LWIA
  - e. For events of less than 25 all Rapid Response activities will be conducted by the Grantee/LWIA.
- 4. Commerce and/or Grantee/LWIA will submit Trade petitions as follows:
  - a. Commerce will submit petitions to USDOL for layoffs of 25 and more workers
  - b. Grantee/LWIA will submit Trade petitions to USDOL for layoffs less than 25 (even if the worker group is one worker)
  - c. Commerce Rapid Response staff will offer any necessary assistance regardless of the size of the event
- 5. When a layoff occurs and Trade certification is probable, Commerce will schedule a Layoff Workshop Rapid Response meeting with the employer and mandated partners for events of 25 and more. Grantee/LWIA will be responsible for scheduling workshops with mandated partners for events of less than 25. Rapid Response mandated partners include:
  - a. Department of Commerce Economic Opportunity (Commerce)
  - b. Illinois Department Employment Security (IDES)
  - c. Grantee/LWIA
- 6. United States Department of Labor posts filed petitions and certifications on their Web site <a href="https://www.doleta.gov/tradeact/taa/taa\_search\_form.cfm">https://www.doleta.gov/tradeact/taa/taa\_search\_form.cfm</a>
- 7. Commerce notifies Grantee/LWIA and IDES of the certification
- 8. IDES provides COMMERCE with the employee list who then shares it with Grantee/LWIA
- 9. Employee outreach may occur with the following scenarios:

- a. If employees are still working; and a non-Trade Layoff Workshop Rapid Response meeting has already occurred at the company; then Commerce, Grantee/LWIA, IDES, and the employer human resource department will work collaboratively to initiate outreach and invitations for Trade Rapid Response.
- b. If the customers have been laid-off, IDES and Grantee/LWIA are responsible for outreach and invitations. Commerce, Grantee/LWIA, and IDES are responsible for:
  - i. Setting dates for Trade Rapid Response informational meeting
  - ii. Contacting workers following the Layoff Workshop Rapid Response meeting
  - iii. At the Trade Rapid Response Workshop, the Grantee/LWIA schedules appointments with Grantee/LWIA for intake
- 10. Layoff Workshop Rapid Response Meeting Overview
  - a. Commerce representative gives a high level overview of TAA services and available locations for services
  - b. IDES provides an overview of unemployment insurance, Reemployment Trade Adjustment Assistance (RTAA), and Trade Readjustment Allowance (TRA)
  - c. Grantee/LWIA reads the BRO document with participants that are part of the certified worker group or a pending worker group. Each participant must sign the Benefit Rights and Obligations (BRO) signature page during this meeting and be provided a copy of the signed BRO
  - d. Where available, facilitate the registration of an Illinois workNet account
  - e. Workshops can be customized with other community partners as appropriate and/or needed, i.e. USDOL, Illinois Department of Insurance.
- 11. Commerce and Grantee/LWIA will complete required Dislocation Event Tracking System DETS entries:
  - a. Commerce will make DETS entries for events of 25 or more employees
  - b. Grantee/LWIA will make DETS entries for all events of less than 25 employees
