What to Expect:

- **3-Hour Timed Assessment**
- 148 Multiple Choice Questions
- This test is administered at a location.
- It may be given in one (3-hour), two (90-minute), or three (60-minute) sessions.
- This assessment is graded. Once you successfully pass the assessment, you earn a NOCTI • Certificate / Digital Badge.

Frequency:

- This assessment was developed to be used as a final assessment. It should be completed towards the end of the work experience or work readiness program.
- It can be taken multiple times, so it could be used as a pre- and post-assessment.

Access to the Assessment and Results:

- Students can access saved results through their My Dashboard. All saved results stay with the student's account.
- Approved Illinois workNet partners will able view saved results through the Customer Support Center tools.

Use the Results:

- Review the results with the customer. •
- Use the Job Skill Guides and Digital Literacy Guides examples of essential workplace skills and related • resources.
- Customers earn the NOCTI 21st Century Skills Certificate / Digital Badge when they ٠ successfully complete the assessment.
