
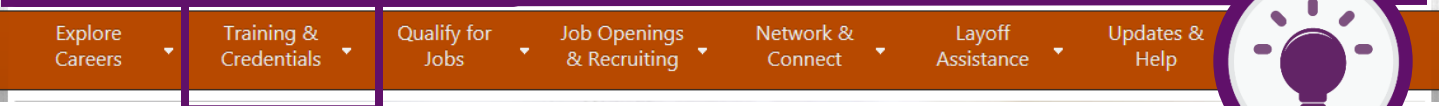


## Selecting and Financing Training – Illinois workNet Beta Website




Use this portion of Illinois workNet to determine how you can upgrade your skills to either obtain a job, retain a job or gain a job when switching careers. Follow as we review the various components.

## Training Programs

Whether you are just starting out in the workforce or changing career paths, being hired or retaining a job may require training. Find postsecondary programs approved by the Illinois Community College Board, Illinois Board of Higher Education, or Local Workforce Boards. This portion of our website helps you find training programs that you can pursue.

1. Select All programs, WIOA Providers Only, or Non-WIOA Providers Only
2. Enter a Program Keyword (i.e. welding)
3. Enter a Provider/School Name (i.e. a local community college)
4. Enter City or ZIP Code
5. Change Your Search Radius if Desired
6. Select Search
7. Review the Results





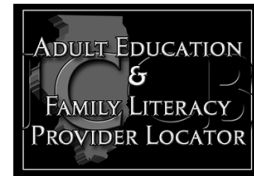
