Economics Across the Curriculum is a three-day summer program for teachers of grades 6-12 presented by the American Institute for Economic Research (AIER) in collaboration with Econ Illinois and the Federal Reserve Banks of Chicago & St. Louis

Dates: July 11 - 13, 2016

Location: Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago

Learn ways to teach: Money & Inflation; Business cycles & Unemployment; and Government & the Economy

Include economic concepts in your math, English, social studies, or language classes. The program's curriculum is aligned with national teaching standards and the latest pedagogy.

Course is taught by national experts in economics and economic education including a pre-workshop online component.

Earn Graduate in-service credits or professional development hours and a completion certificate:

- 32 non-credit PDH's from Econ Illinois (IL teachers only) - Free
- 45 non-credit PDP's from Mass. College of Liberal Arts (non-IL teachers) - \$100
- AIER Certificate of completion - Free
- 3 graduate in-service credits from Mass. College of Liberal Arts - \$300

Before: Register and submit event fee of \$50. Completion of pre-workshop online component required.

During: Attend **each** day's sessions and complete the lesson plan idea. Complimentary breakfast and lunch served daily; networking reception on day 2 to engage with other educators and experts in the field of economics.

After: Each teacher who completes the training will have the opportunity to participate in field-testing their lesson plan idea and earn a stipend of \$500. Every participant will receive the complete 2016 Teach the Teachers Initiative Training Manual and other complimentary curriculum.

Event Outcomes: A critiqued lesson plan idea; New ideas to incorporate into your classes; Earn a stipend by field-testing your lesson plan; Follow up with AIER and the alumni community.
