## Two challenges to test your students' knowledge & skills

The **Illinois Personal Finance Challenge (IPFC)** will test your students' knowledge of consumer concepts and personal finance skills, and is open to all high school students in Illinois



The **Illinois Econ Challenge (ILEC)** will test your students' knowledge of Economics and is open to all high school economics students currently *or previously* enrolled in:

- Advanced Placement (Micro and/or Macro) Economics
  - International Baccalaureate (pre-IB & IB)
- Honors, two-semester, or any other advanced course in economics

Both high school competitions offer preliminary online testing where winners (ten teams) will qualify for the State Final events held in Chicago. Winning teams move on to the National Semi-Final round (ILEC) and National Finals (IPFC). There are no fees to participate and prizes are awarded for the winning state teams.
