



- ➤ We work with young adults from the ages of 14 24.
- Our students have multiple challenges in their lives – from homelessness, lack of family support, education issues and food insecurity.
- Many have spent time in the justice system
- Many of our young women live in unstable and unsafe housing dealing with rape, violence, neglect and often mothering at young ages.
- Curt's Café There are no "Throw Away" young folks for us.





History

- Susan Trieschmann, founder and Executive Director
- Original owner of Food for Thought, has been in the catering business for 30+ years
- Original member of Restorative Justice Evanston
- She saw the impact of incarcerating youth and vowed to make a difference
- Finding an alternative to incarceration with a work force development program
- Hence...Curt's Café 9 years to date



Our Program

- Our program is different than most workforce training because we teach in a working café that is accessed by the public, providing a learning experience for both our students & community.
- ➤ The goal for our students is to attain a job, keep that job, secure safe housing and to become contributing members of our communities.
- ➤ The obstacles are huge. Felony records, ID's, documents, anger, teen pregnancy, sexual assault, domestic violence
- Our focus: Creating a supportive atmosphere, gaining trust and caring while demanding a commitment.

- Meet regularly with students








Work Force Curriculum



Return on Investment








Return on Investment

- > Job Placement
- Education
 GED and College







Reduced Recidivism

- > Typical Rate for this demographic is 87%
- > Of 195 graduates, only 3 have been reincarcerated
- > Cost of training program per student \$9,000 per year
- > Cost of incarceration \$147, 767 per year
