The U.S. Departments of Labor and Education are pleased to inform you that we have approved Illinois's modification to the program year (PY) 2016 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Unified State Plan submitted on March 30, 2018 pursuant to section 102(c)(3)(A) of WIOA. The State Plan modification covers PYs 2018 and 2019 and will take effect July 1, 2018. If your modification included requests for waivers of WIOA Title I or Wagner-Peyser requirements, you will receive a separate communication from the Department of Labor with the disposition of those requests.
